A CONVERSATION WITH THE PLAYWRIGHT AND DIRECTOR

KEITH HOVIS: Jefferson Township Sparkling Junior Talent Pageant was born out of writer's block on a different piece, plus being in a place of transition. I had entered my 30's having spent seven years working in various roles for commissioners within Governor Dayton's administration (in addition to my work in theatre), and I was faced with having only a year left before the end of his term to figure out the next step in my career. The unknowns were terrifying. At the same time, I was watching those around me try to figure out the same things. Friends and family at all different stages of life were reassessing their paths and what happiness means. I did a lot of reflecting on the people and events that shaped me: growing up in small-town Minnesota, the values instilled in me by that community, my family, current friends, former friends, and those first moments in life when I experienced failure. Those themes really resonated with me, so I started writing. Finding a mix of irreverent humor and heartfelt moments felt like the best way to share them

LAURA LEFFLER: That's a very serious and scary place for a very joyful and funny show to come from. When I saw the Fringe version of the piece, I was so captivated by the energy of it all. The whole room felt like it was crackling with lightning. I love that feeling as an audience member where you can tell the performers are having fun and loving each other. That's a special kind of magic. And there were also these holes in it, plot holes! The performers would look into the audience and say, okay, we're gonna skip this part and jump ahead. That was the spark that ignited for me - oh, there's more to find here! - and maybe Park Square could be a home to feed that fire.

KH: Haha! I think the best comedy is developed out of moments that challenge us. Even back to Shakespeare's use of the fool, comedy has this innate way to expose the soul and open up a dialogue between people. It's also so therapeutic and cathartic. The experience at the Fringe was such pure joy. I got to play in the room with my best friends and create

something that we all believed in. I love seeing performers take ownership of new material and make it their own. It's why I am so drawn to new work. There is endless possibility to explore. Then to receive the call from Park Square? Unreal. As a writer, I am constantly asking people to believe in my vision and to go on a journey and invest in me – whether that's an investment of time, talent, funding, etc., so having the opportunity to expand the piece was outside my wildest dreams. I was so excited to have Laura sign on as director as well. I feel so lucky.

LL: I was excited! I've been developing new work in the Twin Cities for over 13 years, but this one feels special. I've never developed a new musical on this scale before, so it's been an exciting challenge in a lot of ways, and it's been such an amazing blessing to have the support of so many amazing artists on the creative team. For example, how often do the designers get to be involved in the earliest workshops? It's a gift.

KH: Oh my gosh. The design team! This town has such incredible talent. Plus, being able to keep my original cast was truly a blessing. The show is written with and for them, and having that trust built into the process is invaluable. As I look back at early drafts, we have taken the show in so many different directions in order to arrive at the best way to tell the story. I honestly believe we've arrived at the version of the show it was always meant to be. Writing a new musical has so many moving parts. It's a lot of work, but seeing it all come together is amazing.

PLAYWRIGHT



KEITH HOVIS is a Twin Cities based composer and playwright making his Park Square debut. Other full-length musicals include the horror satire *Teenage Misery*, and *Pioneer Suite*, which was commissioned by Freshwater Theatre and featured at the 2014 Ivey Awards. As a composer, he has worked on *The Skriker* with Fortune's Fool

Theater and *Two Mile Hollow* with Theater Mu/Mixed Blood. Other work includes the play *Public Exposure* with Market Garden Theater and *A Morbid History of Sons and Daughters*, a devised musical he co-created for the 2018 Twin Cities Horror Festival. The original, one-hour version of *Jefferson Township* premiered in the Minnesota Fringe Festival in 2017 and was honored by the Minnesota Theater Awards as an Exceptional New Work. He is a proud alum of the Nautilus Composer-Librettist Studio. **Upcoming:** *Edith Gets High*, a new musical, at the 2019 Minnesota Fringe Festival, and *Immortal* with Trademark Theater. Thank you to the cast and crew for going on this journey with me; and thank you to my family and friends for their support.
